Hanukkah is sundown December 10th-sundown December 18th, 2020. Yule is December 21st, 2020. Christmas is December 25, 2020. Kwanzaa is December 26, 2020 – January 1, 2021. New Year's Eve is December 31st 2020 and New Year's Day is January 1st 2021.

Follow these directions to safely celebrate the winter holidays.

What is different this year for the winter holidays?

- The CDC has recommended that traditional large group gatherings be avoided completely this year.
- The CDC recommends avoiding celebrating with anyone outside your household.
